Myth: Speaking two languages to a child may cause a speech or language disorder. Fact: If a bilingual child has a speech or language problem, it will show up in both languages. However, these problems are not caused by learning two languages. Bilingualism should almost never be used as an explanation for speech or language disorder.

Types of Bilingual Development. There are many ways to learn more than one language. Some children speak 2 languages from birth (simultaneous dual language learner) and some learn one first and the second later (sequential dual language learner).

Bilingualism and Autism Spectrum Disorder

Studies of bilingual children with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) have focused on early language development using parent report measures. However, the effect of bilingual exposure on more complex linguistic abilities is unknown. In the current study, we examined the impact of amount of language exposure on vocabulary and morphological skills in school-aged children with ASD who did not have intellectual disability.

Existing studies indicate that speech and language development in bilingual children is similar, although not identical, to that of their monolingual peers. Studies of bilingual children with speech and language disorders, though even more limited in number and scope, also point to similarities.

Clinical Implications of Research on Language Development ...

For children 4 to 8 years of age, it may be difficult to separate second-language learning difficulties resulting from a weak first-language system from true language disorders. 13 Children 8 years and older may have a more well-developed first language, but they may be expected to function at a higher level in their still-developing second language.
