### ED Charting and Coding: Critical Care Time

Severity of illness and potential for decompensation. Vital signs (hypotension, hypoxia, etc) and how these changed through the case. Tests performed and your interpretation of the results. Treatments provided, including: supplemental oxygen, IV fluids, medications, blood transfusions, burn/wound care.
