The third stage involves the removal or expulsion of the placenta. During the process of labor your health care provider may or may not perform an internal vaginal exam. This exam checks for cervical effacement, cervical dilation, and the baby's position, presentation, and station.

Stages of Labor — First, Second, and Third Labor Stages

The third stage of labor, the elimination or expulsion of the placenta, starts from the moment the child is removed to the birth canal and ends when all placental tissue is evacuated from the uterus.
