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Some disorders that can be caused by abuse, misuse or overuse of your voice include: Laryngitis : This condition is an inflammation (swelling) of the vocal cords. Vocal cord nodules : In this condition, small, benign, callus-like, inflammatory lesions (growths) form on your focal cords.

Most laryngeal disorders cause dysphonia, which is impairment of the voice. A persistent change in the voice (eg, > 3 weeks) requires visualization of the vocal cords, including their mobility.

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Disorders affecting thyroid hormone, female and male hormones, and growth hormones can cause voice disorders. Misuse of the

Voice disorders occur with a change in the voice, often described as hoarseness, roughness, or a raspy quality. People with voice disorders often complain about or notice changes in pitch, loss of voice, loss of endurance, and sometimes a sharp or dull pain associated with voice use.

A number of different systems are used for classifying voice disorders. For the purposes of this document, voice disorders are categorized as follows: Organic — voice disorders that are physiological in nature and result from alterations in respiratory, laryngeal, or vocal tract mechanisms.

Voice Disorders: Overview

Physiologic voice therapy programs strive to balance the three subsystems of voice production (respiration, phonation, and resonance) as opposed to working directly on isolated voice symptoms. Most physiologic approaches may be used with a variety of disorders that result in hyper- and hypofunctional vocal patterns.

Voice Disorders: Treatment

Any condition that affects the performance of the voice-producing organ, the larynx, can cause a voice disorder. Usually, hoarseness is the main symptom, but laryngeal disorders can cause other more subtle problems. Common Symptoms of Laryngeal Disorders Hoarseness or breathiness of the voice

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Laryngeal cancer is cancer of the voice box. Cancer most commonly occurs on the vocal folds causing hoarseness or shortness of breath. Some individuals may notice symptoms of increased cough and difficulty swallowing. Others may note a neck mass, throat or neck pain, or even ear pain. When found early, success rates at treating laryngeal cancer are very high.

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Muscle tension dysphonia: Muscle tension dysphonia is voice change due to excessive muscle tension in and around the voice box. It can develop during laryngitis and remain even after the vocal cords have healed. It can also be caused by stress, over use of the voice, and often co-occur with other voice disorders.

Laryngeal dystonia is a neurological condition affecting the larynx associated either with voice disturbance or, much less commonly, with breathing disturbance or, yet more infrequently, with both. The voice disturbance is referred to as spasmodic dysphonia. The breathing manifestation is called respiratory dystonia.
